HB 498 Reengrossed

Edmonston

Abstract: Prohibits government personnel and agencies from discriminating against persons based on vaccination or immunity status.

<u>Proposed law</u> prohibits a state or local government official or agency from distinguishing between individuals based on whether a person has or has not had a vaccination or is or is not immune to a virus. Provides examples of discrimination that is prohibited.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides exceptions applicable to providing medical services.

<u>Proposed law provides an exception for present law immunization requirements for students, except for vaccines targeting COVID-19 or SARS-COV2.</u>

<u>Proposed law</u> authorizes any person to commence a suit for the issuance of a writ of mandamus or injunctive or declaratory relief to require compliance with the provisions of <u>proposed law</u>, together with reasonable attorney fees and costs.

Summary of Amendments Adopted by House

The Committee Amendments Proposed by <u>House Committee on Civil Law and Procedure</u> to the <u>original</u> bill:

- 1. Add an exception prohibiting government officials or agencies from distinguishing COVID-19 immunization requirements for students.
- 2. Remove the venue provision.
