COMMENDATIONS. Commends Mia LeJeune on being awarded the 2021 Truman Scholarship.

1	A RESOLUTION
2	To commend Mia LeJeune, a Louisiana State University student, on being named a Truman
3	Scholar.
4	WHEREAS, it is appropriate to commend LSU student, Mia LeJeune, upon her being
5	selected to receive a Harry S. Truman Scholarship; and
6	WHEREAS, Mia LeJeune is studying mass communication with a concentration in
7	political communication and a minor in history at LSU; and
8	WHEREAS, her passion is rooted in youth voting and democratic campaigns and
9	elections and throughout her time at LSU, Mia has helped to register over 6,000 students to
10	vote with her organization, Geaux Vote, a nonpartisan, student driven organization dedicated
11	to voter registration and civic engagement; and
12	WHEREAS, Mia worked as the scheduler on Democratic Governor John Bel
13	Edwards' reelection campaign, and by forgoing her sophomore year at LSU, helped him to
14	secure a victory in a traditionally conservative state; and
15	WHEREAS, in 2019, she went on to work as a Governor's Fellow at the Department
16	of Children and Family Services where she presented a policy proposal to the governor that
17	instituted a statewide, multidisciplinary data sharing platform to streamline application
18	processes for benefit programs; and

1	WHEREAS, the department launched a pilot program last year, and now uses the
2	communications plan that Mia created to recruit foster parents; and
3	WHEREAS, Mia spent 2020 working on various local campaigns, including the
4	reelection of Mayor Sharon Weston Broome, Baton Rouge's first female mayor; and
5	WHEREAS, she is currently running for student body president and is hopeful for
6	the opportunity to work towards institutionalizing on-campus civic engagement and voter
7	registration; and
8	WHEREAS, Mia is also working on her honors college thesis, a study of the history
9	of student activism at LSU; and
10	WHEREAS, the Truman Scholarship was established by Congress in 1975 as the
11	federal memorial to the thirty-third president of the United States, Harry S. Truman; and
12	WHEREAS, the mission of the Truman Scholarship Foundation is to find and
13	recognize college students with exceptional leadership potential who are committed to
14	careers in government, the nonprofit or advocacy sectors, education, or elsewhere in public
15	service; and
16	WHEREAS, the Truman Scholarship provides its recipients with financial support
17	for graduate study, leadership training, and fellowship with other students who are
18	committed to making a difference through public service; and
19	WHEREAS, Truman Scholars are required to work in public service for three of the
20	seven years following completion of a foundation-funded graduate degree program as a
21	condition of their receiving Truman Scholarship funds; and
22	WHEREAS, the Truman Scholarship provides funding for graduate study, along with
23	priority admission and supplemental financial aid at several premier graduate institutions,
24	leadership training, career and graduate school counseling, and special internship
25	opportunities within the federal government; and
26	WHEREAS, Mia LeJeune merits a special measure of commendation for her
27	outstanding accomplishments and contributions as a citizen and scholar.
28	THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Senate of the Legislature of Louisiana
29	does hereby commend Mia LeJeune, a student at Louisiana State University, upon being
30	named a Truman Scholar, does hereby recognize and record for posterity her exceptional
