STATE SYMBOL: Designates the song "Southern Nights" by Allen Toussaint as the official state cultural song

1	AN ACT
2	To amend and reenact R.S. 49:155(A) and (B), relative to state symbols; to designate
3	"Southern Nights" by Allen Toussaint as the official state cultural song; and to
4	provide for related matters.
5	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
6	Section 1. R.S. 49:155(A) and (B) are hereby amended and reenacted to read as
7	follows:
8	§155.7. State song
9	A. The official state song for the State of Louisiana shall be a musical
10	composition, with words and music by Doralice Fontane, entitled: "Give Me
11	Louisiana"; the words and music ⁺ reading as follows:

<u>Proposed law</u> designates "Southern Nights", a musical composition with lyrics and music by Allen Toussaint, as the official state cultural song.

(Adds R.S. 49:155.7)

Summary of Amendments Adopted by House

The House Floor Amendments to the engrossed bill:

- 1. Change "Southern Nights" <u>from</u> a state song <u>to</u> a state cultural song.
- 2. Remove "Give Me Louisiana" as a state song.
