2 On page 2, delete lines 9 through 13 in their entirety and insert the following:

"B.(1) Whoever commits the crime of aggravated distribution of a controlled dangerous substance as provided in Subsection A(1) or (2) of this Section shall be imprisoned at hard labor for not more than twenty years and in addition may be fined not more than fifty thousand dollars.

(2) Whoever commits the crime of aggravated distribution of a controlled dangerous substance as provided in Subsection A(1) or (2) of this Section when the offender distributes or dispenses fentanyl or a mixture or substance containing a detectable amount of fentanyl or its analogues, or carfentanil or a mixture or substance containing a detectable amount of carfentanil or its analogues, shall be imprisoned at hard labor for not less than five years nor more than forty years and in addition may be fined not more than fifty thousand dollars.

15(3) Whoever commits the crime of aggravated distribution of a16controlled dangerous substance as provided in Subsection A(3) of this Section17shall be imprisoned at hard labor for not less than five years nor more than18forty years and in addition may be fined not more than fifty thousand dollars."

- 20 On page 2, delete lines 14 through 17 in their entirety and insert the following:

21 "C. Notwithstanding any other provision of law to the contrary, a person 22 acting in good faith who seeks medical assistance for an individual experiencing 23 a drug-related overdose may not be charged, prosecuted, or penalized for 24 aggravated distribution of a controlled dangerous substance if the evidence for 25 aggravated distribution of a controlled dangerous substance was obtained as a 26 result of the person's seeking medical assistance. Protection in this Subsection 27 from prosecution for aggravated distribution of a controlled dangerous 28 substance may not be grounds for suppression of evidence in other criminal 29 prosecutions."
