Prefiled pursuant to Article III, Section 2(A)(4)(b)(i) of the Constitution of Louisiana.

1	AN ACT
2	To enact R.S. 17:437.2 and 3996(B)(59), relative to training for certain school employees;
3	to provide for in-service training for teachers, school counselors, principals, and
4	certain other school administrators on adverse childhood experiences and
5	trauma-informed education; to provide for the responsibilities of the State Board of
6	Elementary and Secondary Education; and to provide for related matters.
7	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
8	Section 1. R.S. 17:437.2 and 3996(B)(59) are hereby enacted to read as follows:
9	§437.2. Adverse childhood experiences; trauma-informed education; in-service
10	training
11	A. As used in this Section:
12	(1) "Adverse childhood experiences" means all types of abuse, neglect,
13	and other traumatic childhood experiences linked to lifelong health and social
14	problems including:
15	(a) Physical, sexual, and emotional abuse.
16	(b) Physical or emotional neglect.
17	(c) Domestic violence.
18	(d) Divorce or separation of a parent or caregiver.
19	(e) Substance abuse by a household member.
20	(f) Mental illness of a household member.
21	(g) Incarceration of a household member.
22	(2) "Trauma-informed education" means a school-wide approach to
23	education and a classroom-based approach to student learning that recognizes
24	the signs and symptoms of adverse childhood experiences in students, families,
25	and staff and responds by integrating knowledge about trauma-informed

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1	policies, professional learning, procedures, and practices to address the
2	long-term effects of adverse childhood experiences on a student's cognitive
3	functioning and his physical, social, emotional, and mental well-being.
4	<b>B.(1)</b> The State Board of Elementary and Secondary Education, after
5	consultation with the Louisiana Department of Health, office of public health,
6	shall develop and adopt guidelines for in-service training in recognizing the
7	signs and symptoms of adverse childhood experiences and the utilization of
8	trauma-informed educational practices to address student needs resulting from
9	these experiences.
10	(2) The board shall adopt rules to require that, beginning with the 2021-
11	2022 school year, all public and approved nonpublic school teachers, school
12	counselors, principals, and other school administrators for whom the training
13	is considered beneficial by the board shall annually participate in at least one
14	hour of in-service training on recognizing adverse childhood experiences and
15	the utilization of trauma-informed education. The in-service training required
16	by this Paragraph shall be provided on a day that other types of in-service
17	training will be provided in accordance with the school calendar adopted by
18	each public school governing authority.
19	<b>C.</b> The training shall include research-based information regarding the
20	<u>following:</u>
21	(1) The impact of adverse childhood experiences on students' educational
22	experiences and on the school and classroom culture.
23	(2) How to identify the signs and symptoms of adverse childhood
24	experiences.
25	(3) Best practices for schools and classrooms regarding trauma-informed
26	approaches to education.
27	(4) Recognition of the impact of secondary trauma on school employees.
28	<b>D.</b> The State Board of Elementary and Secondary Education shall adopt
29	rules in accordance with the Administrative Procedure Act to implement the
30	provisions of this Section.

2	§3996. Charter schools; exemptions; requirements

4	B. Notwithstanding any state law, rule, or regulation to the contrary and
5	except as may be otherwise specifically provided for in an approved charter, a
6	charter school established and operated in accordance with the provisions of this
7	Chapter and its approved charter and the school's officers and employees shall be
8	exempt from all statutory mandates or other statutory requirements that are
9	applicable to public schools and to public school officers and employees except for
10	the following laws otherwise applicable to public schools with the same grades:

13	trauma-informed education, R.S. 17:437.2.

15	Section 2. This Act shall become effective upon signature by the governor or, if not
16	signed by the governor, upon expiration of the time for bills to become law without signature
17	by the governor, as provided by Article III, Section 18 of the Constitution of Louisiana. If
18	vetoed by the governor and subsequently approved by the legislature, this Act shall become
19	effective on the day following such approval.
