<u>Existing law</u> provides that the legislative intent of <u>existing law</u> known as the Specialized Provider Licensing Act, R.S. 46:1401 et seq., is to protect the health, safety, and well-being of children and youth who are in out-of-home care on a regular or consistent basis. Provides for licensing by the Dept. of Children and Family Services (DCFS) of specialized providers, defined as child-placing agencies, maternity homes, and certain residential homes providing care for children. Authorizes DCFS to issue sanctions against specialized providers operating in violation of regulations adopted pursuant to existing law.

<u>Prior law</u> relative to sanctions against specialized providers referred to violations related to the state central registry disclosure process. <u>New law</u> revises this reference to refer instead to violations related to state central registry clearances.

Effective August 1, 2021.
