Existing law provides for governance of Registrar of Voters Employees' Retirement System by a board of trustees composed of:

- (1) A member of the House Committee on Retirement appointed by the speaker of the House of Representatives, or the member's designee.
- (2) The chairman of the Senate Committee on Retirement or his designee.
- (3) The secretary of state or his designee.
- (4) The state treasurer or his designee.
- (5) Six active and contributing members of the system elected by the members of the system.

Existing law requires that the six active member trustees have a minimum numbers of years of creditable service in the system. Prior law required at least 10 years of creditable service in the system. New law requires five years of creditable service.

Existing law provides that the term of the active member trustees is four years and limits the number of consecutive terms a member may serve. Prior law provided that the limit was two consecutive terms. New law increases that limit to three.

Effective July 1, 2021.
