DISCRIMINATION: (Constitutional Amendment) Prohibits discrimination based on vaccination or immunity status

A JOINT RESOLUTION

Proposing to amend Article I, Sections 3 and 12 of the Constitution of Louisiana, to prohibit arbitrary, capricious, or unreasonable discrimination based on vaccination or immunity status; to prohibit discrimination in access to public areas, accommodations, and facilities based on vaccination or immunity status; to provide for submission of the proposed amendment to the electors; and to provide for related matters.

Section 1. Be it resolved by the Legislature of Louisiana, two-thirds of the members elected to each house concurring, that there shall be submitted to the electors of the state of Louisiana, for their approval or rejection in the manner provided by law, a proposal to amend Article I, Sections 3 and 12 of the Constitution of Louisiana, to read as follows:

§3. Right to Individual Dignity

Section 3. No person shall be denied the equal protection of the laws. No law shall discriminate against a person because of race or religious ideas, beliefs, or affiliations. No law shall arbitrarily, capriciously, or unreasonably discriminate against a person because of birth, age, sex, culture, physical condition, or political ideas or affiliations. Physical condition includes a person's vaccination status or immunity status. Slavery and involuntary servitude are prohibited, except in the latter case as punishment for crime.

Abstract: Prohibits arbitrary, capricious, or unreasonable discrimination based on a person's vaccination status or immunity status.

Present constitution provides that no law shall arbitrarily, capriciously, or unreasonably discriminate against a person because of birth, age, sex, culture, physical condition, or political ideas or affiliations.

Present constitution further provides that in access to public areas, accommodations, and facilities, every person shall be free from arbitrary, capricious, or unreasonable discrimination based on age, sex, or physical condition

<u>Proposed constitution</u> maintains <u>present constitution</u> and provides that physical condition includes a person's vaccination status or immunity status.

Provides for submission of the proposed amendment to the voters at the statewide election to be held Nov. 8, 2022.
