MTR VEHICLE/LICEN PLATES: Creates military honor license plates

2	To enact R.S. 47:490.34 through 490.37, relative to military honor license plates; to provide
3	for the establishment of a military honor license plate for recipients of the
4	Distinguished Flying Cross, Air Medal, Defense Distinguished Service Medal, and
5	Legion of Merit awards; to provide for the creation, issuance, fees, distribution, and
6	rule promulgation applicable to design of such plates; and to provide for related
7	matters.
8	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
9	Section 1. R.S. 47:490.34 through 490.37 are hereby enacted to read as follows:
10	§490.34. Military honor license plates; "Distinguished Flying Cross Recipient"
11	A. The secretary of the Department of Public Safety and Corrections shall
12	establish a military honor license plate to be known as the "Distinguished Flying
13	Cross Recipient" plate.
14	B. Upon application of a "Distinguished Flying Cross Recipient", the
15	secretary of the Department of Public Safety and Corrections shall issue a military
16	honor license plate to be used in lieu of a regular motor vehicle registration plate.
17	The license plate shall be restricted to use on passenger cars, pickup trucks,
18	recreational vehicles, motorcycles, and vans. The "Distinguished Flying Cross
19	Recipient" plate shall bear a likeness of the award centered on the left side of the

1	license plate and the words "Distinguished Flying Cross Recipient" centered on the
2	bottom of the plate under the license plate number.
3	C. The charge for the license plate shall be the standard motor vehicle
4	license tax imposed by Article VII, Section 5 of the Constitution of Louisiana as
5	provided in R.S. 47:463, and a handling fee of three dollars and fifty cents for each
6	plate to be retained by the department to offset a portion of administrative costs.
7	D. The secretary shall adopt rules and regulations to implement the
8	provisions of this Section, including but not limited to rules governing the transfer
9	of license plates from one vehicle to another and the disposition of such license
10	plates.
11	E.(1) Any applicant who qualifies for the military honor license plate

24	A. The secretary of the Department of Public Safety and Corrections shall
25	establish a military honor license plate to be known as the "Air Medal" plate.
26	B. Upon application of an "Air Medal" recipient, the secretary of the
27	Department of Public Safety and Corrections shall issue a military honor license
28	plate to be used in lieu of a regular motor vehicle registration plate. The license plate
29	shall be restricted to use on passenger cars, pickup trucks, recreational vehicles,

1	motorcycles, and vans. The military honor license plate shall be known as the "Air
2	Medal" license plate and shall bear a likeness of the award centered on the left side
3	of the license plate and the words "Air Medal" centered on the bottom of the plate
4	under the license plate number.
5	C. The charge for the license plate shall be the standard motor vehicle
6	license tax imposed by Article VII, Section 5 of the Constitution of Louisiana as

27	A. The secretary of the Department of Public Safety and Corrections shall
28	establish a military honor license plate to be known as the "Defense Distinguished
29	Service Medal" plate.

B. Upon application of a "Defense Distinguished Service Medal" recipient,
the secretary of the Department of Public Safety and Corrections shall issue a
military honor license plate to be used in lieu of a regular motor vehicle registration
plate. The license plate shall be restricted to use on passenger cars, pickup trucks,
recreational vehicles, motorcycles, and vans. The "Defense Distinguished Service
Medal" plate shall bear a likeness of the award centered on the left side of the license
plate and the words "Defense Distinguished Service Medal" centered on the bottom
of the plate under the license plate number.
C. The charge for the license plate shall be the standard motor vehicle
license tax imposed by Article VII, Section 5 of the Constitution of Louisiana as
provided in R.S. 47:463, and a handling fee of three dollars and fifty cents for each
plate to be retained by the department to offset a portion of administrative costs.
D. The secretary shall adopt rules and regulations to implement the

2	A. The secretary of the Department of Public Safety and Corrections shall
3	establish a military honor license plate to be known as the "Legion of Merit
4	Recipient" plate.
5	B. Upon application of a "Legion of Merit Recipient" recipient, the secretary
6	of the Department of Public Safety and Corrections shall issue a military honor
7	license plate to be used in lieu of a regular motor vehicle registration plate. The
8	license plate shall be restricted to use on passenger cars, pickup trucks, recreational
9	vehicles, motorcycles, and vans. The "Legion of Merit Recipient" plate shall bear
10	a likeness of the award centered on the left side of the license plate and the words
11	"Legion of Merit Recipient" centered on the bottom of the plate under the license
12	plate number.
13	C. The charge for the license plate shall be the standard motor vehicle
14	license tax imposed by Article VII, Section 5 of the Constitution of Louisiana as
15	provided in R.S. 47:463, and a handling fee of three dollars and fifty cents for each
16	plate to be retained by the department to offset a portion of administrative costs.

of the license plate to the surviving spouse. A military honor license plate
transferred pursuant to this Paragraph to a surviving spouse shall be returned to the
secretary upon the death or remarriage of the surviving spouse.

Section 2. The Department of Public Safety and Corrections, office of motor
vehicles, is hereby directed to create the military honor license plate when the applicable
statutory provisions are met and its system is updated to accommodate the creation of new
plates.

Abstract: Creates the "Distinguished Flying Cross", "Air Medal", "Defense Distinguished Service Medal", and "Legion of Merit", awards specialty license plates.

<u>Proposed law</u> creates the "Distinguished Flying Cross", "Air Medal", "Defense Distinguished Service Medal", and "Legion of Merit" license plates for Distinguished Flying Cross, Air Medal, Defense Distinguished Service Medal, and Legion of Merit recipients, and provides for the use, name, fee, design, and specifications of the specialty plates.

<u>Proposed law</u> requires the secretary of the Dept. of Public Safety and Corrections to adopt rules relative to the implementation of the military honor license plates, including the transfer of the license plate to the surviving spouse and the disposition of the military honor license plates.

<u>Proposed law</u> requires the office of motor vehicles to create the military honor plates provided for in <u>proposed law</u> when the applicable statutory provisions are met and its system is updated to accommodate new plates.
