PHYSICIANS: Provides relative to penalties for the unauthorized practice of medicine

2 To amend and reenact R.S. 37:1290, relative to the regulation of the practice of medicine; 3 to remove certain penalties for the unauthorized practice of medicine; and to provide 4 for related matters. 5 Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana: 6 Section 1. R.S. 37:1290 is hereby amended and reenacted to read as follows: 7 §1290. Penalties 8 Whoever violates any of the provisions of this Part shall, for each offense, be 9 fined not less than two hundred and fifty dollars nor more than five hundred dollars; 10 or imprisoned for not less than ten days nor more than five months, or both.

Abstract: Removes imprisonment from penalty provisions for the unauthorized practice of medicine.

<u>Present law</u> provides that any person who violates <u>present law</u>, relative to the practice of medicine, surgery, and midwifery, shall, for each offense, be fined no less than \$250 nor more than \$500, or imprisoned for no less than 10 days nor more than 5 months, or both.

<u>Proposed law</u> removes imprisonment from the penalty provisions and otherwise retains present law.
