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HB 841 Original	2022 Regular Session	Boyd
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Abstract: Restricts online access to the names of peace officers and judges in a publicly accessible website of a parish property tax assessor or collector.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that any peace officer or judge may request to have his name removed from a publicly accessible website containing the property assessment rolls of a parish property tax assessor or tax collector.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that the request shall be a written request to the parish tax assessor or collector.

Proposed law provides that the peace officer or judge shall provide proof of employment.

<u>Proposed law</u> further provides that a peace officer shall provide proof of commission, badge, and a letter of good standing from his agency of employment.

<u>Present law</u> (R.S. 40:2402) provides that a "peace officer" means any employee of the state, a municipality, sheriff or other public agency, who has certain permanent job duties. <u>Present law</u> also provides that "peace officer" includes certain sheriff's deputies, military police officers, and security personnel employed by the Supreme Court of La. or by a court of appeal of the state of La.

Proposed law applies to the present law definition of peace officer.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that a person wishing to access personal ownership information of a property may request this information from the office of the parish property tax assessor or collector.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that <u>proposed law</u> shall not be construed to restrict public access to records.
