Provides relative to supplemental pay for tribal officers of the Coushatta Tribe of Louisiana

<u>Present law</u> provides for supplemental pay of \$500 per month for any full-time police officer paid by any municipality or by the Chitimacha Tribe of LA, Coushatta Tribe of LA, or the Tunica-Biloxi Tribe of LA that has passed a council-certified training program and completed one year of service. <u>Present law</u> limits the number of officers from the Coushatta Tribe that are eligible for supplemental pay to 8, subject to the approval of the Sheriff of Allen Parish. <u>Proposed law</u> increases the number of eligible officers for supplemental pay from 8 to 20 (an increase of 12) and removes the approval of the Sheriff of Allen Parish.

EXPENDITURE EXPLANATION

Proposed law will increase annual SGF expenditures in Other Requirements Schedule 20-966 - Supplemental Pay by \$72,000 to provide supplemental payments of \$500 monthly to an additional 12 full-time law enforcement officers at Coushatta Tribe of LA beginning in FY 23.

As of March 2022, all 8 police officers of the Coushatta Tribe receiving monthly supplemental pay for a total annual cost of 48,000 in FY 22. The fiscal note estimates supplemental payments for the maximum authorized 20 tribal police officers under this measure of 120,000 annually (20 police officers x 500 per month x 12 months). To the extent all eligible 20 police officers positions are filled and eligible, the proposed law requires an additional supplemental payment beginning in FY 23 of 72,000 SGF (120,000 for 20 police officers - 48,000 for 8 existing police officers).

Note: Note: HB 678 and SB 80 amend the statutes to increase the amount of supplemental pay for eligible law enforcement officers from \$500 per month to \$600 per month. The General Appropriations Bill (HB 1) for FY 23 has a recommended \$25.7 M SGF increase in supplemental pay for law enforcement personnel, which provides funding for the additional \$100 per month supplemental payment to local law enforcement. The \$100 increase would bring the current supplemental payment amount from \$6,000 per year to \$7,200 per year. If HB 678 or SB 80 as well as HB 1 are enacted, this measure would increase annual SGF expenditures by another \$24,000 (20 police officers x \$100 monthly increase x 12 months).

REVENUE EXPLANATION

There is no anticipated direct material effect on governmental revenues as a result of this measure.
