EXPENDITURE EXPLANATION

<u>Proposed law</u> will likely result in an indeterminable increase in expenditures impacting multiple means of finance across all state agencies as a result of all rules set to expire June 30th annually. The Division of Administration - Office of the State Register (OSR) reports there are 255 rules promulgated annually (average amount derived from the past 3 calendar years). The number of rules that will be submitted annually is unknown; but, believed to be significant. NOTE: The Legislative Fiscal Office (LFO) assumes proposed law is prospective application to future rules.

Assuming agencies resubmit rules that are not codified in statute, there will likely be a significant increase in workload for state agencies, the OSR and the LFO to prepare, submit, review, process and/or publish the new information required. The LFO will utilize existing resources to handle the workload increase.

For informational purposes, OSR provided the following information:

Currently, the average page count per document is approximately 5.4 pages for rules submitted. The current publication cost is \$213 per page, resulting in the average publication cost per document of \$1,150. In rulemaking, the document is printed twice (once as a Notice of Intent and once as a Rule), resulting in an average rulemaking cost of \$2,300 per rule. Therefore, the average annual cost is \$586,500 across various means of finance ($$2,300 \times 255 = $586,500$).

NOTE: This scope of this measure impacts all departments, agencies, boards, commissions, and other state entities in the following areas: Administrative Law, Administration, Agriculture & Animals, Financial Institutions, Consumer Credit, Investment Securities & UCC, Economic Development, Community Affairs, Construction, Corporations & Business, Corrections, Criminal Justice & Law Enforcement, Cultural Resources, Elections, Employee Benefits, Environmental Quality - Air, Hazardous Waste & Hazardous Materials, Inactive & Abandoned Hazardous Waste & Hazardous Substance Site Remediation, Solid Waste, Water Quality, Underground Storage Tanks, and Radiation Protection, Government Contracts, Procurement, & Property Control, Horse Racing, Professional & Occupational Standards: Horse Racing Occupations, Insurance, Labor & Employment, Military Forces of the State, Louisiana Gaming, Natural Resources, Office of Mineral Resources, Water Resources Management, Office of Conservation-Natural Gas Policy Act, Pipeline Division, & Pipeline Safety, Surface Mining, Injection & Mining, State Lands, Oil Spill Prevention & Response, Coastal Protection & Restoration Authority, Public Health -General, Food, Drugs, & Cosmetics, Medical Assistance, Sanitary Code, Ethics, Public Safety, Public Works, Retirement, Revenue & Tax Appeals (Revenue Department & Local Sales Tax Disputes), Transportation, Social Services, Treasury Faxation, Public Funds, Uniform Local Sales Tax (Uniform Local Sales Tax Administrative Code), Weights, Measures, & Standards, and Wildlife & Fisheries.

REVENUE EXPLANATION

<u>Proposed law</u> may result in an indeterminable increase in revenue to the OSR for fees associated with rules promulgated annually statewide. The current publication cost is \$213 per page, resulting in the average publication cost per document of \$1,150. In rulemaking, the document is printed twice (once as a Notice of Intent and once as a Rule), resulting in an average rulemaking cost of \$2,300 per rule.
