COMMENDATIONS. Commends the Reginald F. Lewis Scholars.

1	A RESOLUTION
2	To commend the Reginald F. Lewis Scholars as they successfully matriculate throughout the
3	educational equity initiative program.
4	WHEREAS, the University of Louisiana System (UL System), one of the nation's
5	largest highest educational systems, developed the Reginald F. Lewis Scholars program to
6	enhance the academic experience for black males; and
7	WHEREAS, data inspired the UL System when it recognized the disparities
8	comparing black males to all other demographics in higher educational settings; and
9	WHEREAS, the first cohort of scholars were introduced in June 2021, during the UL
10	System Black Male Summit, an event designed to address the challenges black male faculty,
11	staff, and students experience; and
12	WHEREAS, the cohort of scholars comprises eighteen sophomores, two from each
13	UL System member institution, who are participating in the three-year curate educational
14	experience; and
15	WHEREAS, the universities and the cohort of scholars are: Grambling State
16	University, JaDeric Talbert and Isaiah Farrell; Louisiana Tech University, Cameron Green
17	and Da'Voznik Armstrong; McNeese State University, Malaki Johnson and Isaiah E.
18	Johnson; Nicholls State University, John Edmonds and Lance Jones; Northwestern State

1	University, Ebenezer Aggrey and Derrick Varnado; Southeastern Louisiana University,
2	Demille Davis and Dylan James; University of Louisiana at Lafayette, Caleb Franklin and
3	JaCaleb Smith; University of Louisiana at Monroe; Carl Whitlock and Earnest C. Wyatt; and
4	the University of New Orleans, Rabruntae Rachal and Robert Hill; and
5	WHEREAS, the all black male cohort of scholars is filled with a group of diverse
6	individuals with varied backgrounds, interests, and degrees of study; and
7	WHEREAS, named for renowned business leader, Reginald F. Lewis, each scholar
8	is met with high expectations to be diligent and enthusiastic in their academic pursuits, social
9	engagement, and community service; and
10	WHEREAS, each scholar receives a institutional scholarship covering tuition and
11	fees and a meal plan thanks to the various food service partners throughout the UL System;
12	and
13	WHEREAS, throughout the past nine months, the scholars have grown exponentially
14	through countless hours of community service, mentorship sessions, and various personal
15	development opportunities provided by the UL System; and
16	WHEREAS, in January the scholars kicked off a touring exhibit, "carrying a dream"
17	which featured artifacts honoring Dr. Martin Luther King Jr.'s life; and
18	WHEREAS, this summer the scholars will be matched with internships designed to
19	enhance their workplace experience while growing their social network; and
20	WHEREAS, during the cohort's second year, the students will advance their cultural
21	competency by participating in a study abroad program in France; and
22	WHEREAS, this is just the beginning for the Reginald F. Lewis Scholars as each is
23	nurtured to greatly contribute to the future of their university, community, and the state of
24	Louisiana as they pursue their academic dreams.
25	THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Senate of the Legislature of Louisiana
26	does hereby commend the Reginald F. Lewis Scholars as they successfully matriculate
27	through the University of Louisiana System's Reginald F. Lewis Educational Equity
28	Initiative Program.
