FISHING: Provides for hand-grabbing of catfish and the taking of bream in minnow traps

2	To amend and reenact R.S. 56:320(A)(3) and (C)(1), relative to methods for taking fish; to
3	provide for taking of bream with minnow traps; to allow hand-grabbing of catfish;
4	and to provide for related matters.
5	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
6	Section 1. R.S. 56:320(A)(3) and (C)(1) are hereby amended and reenacted to read
7	as follows:
8	§320. Methods of taking freshwater or saltwater fish

11	(3) However, notwithstanding Paragraphs (1) and (2) of this Subsection, and
12	any other provision of law to the contrary, bream of any species may be taken when
13	fishing for sport in freshwater by using a minnow trap that does not exceed twenty-
14	four inches in length and having a throat no larger than one inch by three inches for
15	noncommercial bait purposes in any lake not wholly contained within this state
16	which is in excess of one hundred thousand surface acres.

18	C.(1) No person shall take or possess fish taken by means of spears, poisons,
19	stupefying substances or devices, explosives, guns, tree-topping devices, lead nets,
20	except as provided in R.S. 56:329(B), electricity, or any instrument or device capable

of producing an electric current used in shocking said fish; except a barbless spear or a multi-pronged barbed gig that may be used in salt water for taking flounder. No person shall take or possess game fish taken by means of snagging devices, not including bow and arrow. Catfish may be taken by means of snagging devices and hand-grabbing. Garfish may be taken by means of spears and bows and arrows. It shall be unlawful to possess any of the prohibited instruments, weapons, substances, or devices set out hereinabove in this Subsection with the intent to take fish in violation of the provisions of this Section.

**Abstract:** Allows bream to be taken in minnow traps for use as recreational bait statewide and allows hand-grabbing, otherwise known as "noodling", as a legal method of taking catfish.

Present law provides the legal methods for taking fish.

<u>Present law</u> allows bream to be taken by minnow traps of a certain size for noncommercial bait purposes only in certain lakes.

<u>Proposed law</u> removes the <u>present law</u> restriction to certain lakes to allow bream to be taken in minnow traps for recreational bait purposes statewide.

<u>Present law</u> prohibits the use of snagging devices for taking game fish, but provides an exception for taking catfish by snagging devices.

<u>Proposed law</u> retains <u>present law</u> and adds that catfish may also be taken by hand-grabbing, commonly referred to as "noodling".
