Expands the information required to be provided in health instruction for high school students

Proposed legislation requires public school governing authorities to provide instruction in anatomy and physiology each year to students in grades nine through twelve and authorizes such instruction in grades eight and below. Provides a list of topics which must be taught. Requires that such instruction be medically accurate and developmentally and age-appropriate. Allows students to be excused from instruction upon request of a parent or legal guardian.
