A RESOLUTION

2	To recognize Wednesday, May 4, 2022, as Literacy Day at the Louisiana State Capitol.
3	WHEREAS, 74% of Louisiana's 4th grade students do not read proficiently and
4	dyslexia is a specific learning disability that affects as many as one in five people, 20% of
5	the population; and
6	WHEREAS, students who do not read proficiently by the end of the third grade are
7	four times more likely to drop out of school, and those who have not mastered at least a
8	basic level of reading proficiency are nearly six times as like likely to leave school without
9	earning a diploma; and
10	WHEREAS, The Center for Literacy & Learning was founded in 1992 and is
11	celebrating its 30th anniversary facilitating leading-edge scientific research, knowledge, and
12	best practices that improve teaching and increase student learning; and
13	WHEREAS, The Center for Literacy & Learning uses its 386 years of combined
14	professional education experience to focus on closing the achievement gap by increasing
15	teacher effectiveness and advancing public education reform by providing educators who
16	teach our most at-risk children with professional learning that is specific and targeted to the
17	needs of those students and their fellow teachers; and
18	WHEREAS, with an in-the-trenches approach, The Center for Literacy & Learning

	tackles real-time challenges such as remediating struggling readers, differentiate instruction
2	for diverse learners, and build and sustain collective capacity; and
}	WHEREAS, The Center for Literacy & Learning and the Louisiana Department of
ļ	Education have created a key partnership emphasizing the importance of improving our
	state's literacy rates and launched the Literacy Coach Program in 2020, where our 15
	regional literacy specialists serve over 64 local education agencies, 250 individual schools,
	184 literacy coaches, and approximately 16,000 students; and
	WHEREAS, in 2019 The Center for Literacy & Learning successfully advocated for
	the legislative creation of the Early Literacy Commission, consisting of a body of experts
	guiding the future of literacy policy and programming; and
	WHEREAS, improving literacy rates in Louisiana is necessary to increase Louisiana
	students' success in all other areas of their education.
	THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Senate of the Legislature of Louisiana
	does hereby commend the dedicated work of The Center for Literacy & Learning and does
	hereby extend gratitude for its work in improving reading proficiency in all of Louisiana's
	students; and does hereby designate Wednesday, May 4, 2022, as Literacy Day at the
	Louisiana State Capitol.
