SCHOOLS: Requires public schools to provide free menstrual products in student restrooms or other easily accessible locations

2	To enact R.S. 17:182 and 3996(B)(67), relative to students; to require public school
3	governing authorities to provide free menstrual products for students; and to provide
4	for related matters.
5	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
6	Section 1. R.S. 17:182 and 3996(B)(67) are hereby enacted to read as follows:
7	<u>§182. Menstrual products</u>
8	A. Each public school governing authority shall make menstrual products
9	available in student restrooms or other easily accessible locations. The products
10	shall be provided at no cost to the students.
11	B. For purposes of this Section, "menstrual products" means sanitary napkins
12	and tampons for use in connection with the menstrual cycle.

14	§3996. Charter schools; exemptions; requirements

16	B. Notwithstanding any state law, rule, or regulation to the contrary and
17	except as may be otherwise specifically provided for in an approved charter, a
18	charter school established and operated in accordance with the provisions of this
19	Chapter and its approved charter and the school's officers and employees shall be

Abstract: Requires the provision of free menstrual products in student restrooms or other easily accessible locations.

<u>Proposed law</u> requires each public school governing authority to make free menstrual products (sanitary napkins and tampons) available in student restrooms or other easily accessible locations. Requires <u>proposed law</u> to be implemented not later than the beginning of the 2023-2024 school year.
