
HOUSE COMMITTEE AMENDMENTS

2022 Regular Session

Amendments proposed by House Committee on Health and Welfare to Original House Bill No. 605 by Representative Landry

1 AMENDMENT NO. 1

2 On page 4, delete lines 19 through 27 in their entirety and insert in lieu thereof the following:

3 "(i) Any practice by a healthcare provider that purports to result in a
4 complete and permanent change in a person's sexual orientation or gender identity.

5 (ii) Any practice by a healthcare provider that asserts that a complete and
6 permanent change in a person's sexual orientation or gender identity is necessary.

7 (iii) Any practice by a healthcare provider that, in attempting to change a
8 person's sexual orientation or gender identity, subjects the person to physical
9 discomfort through aversive treatment that causes nausea, vomiting, or other
10 unpleasant physical sensations.

11 (iv) Any practice by a healthcare provider that, in attempting to change a
12 person's sexual orientation or gender identity, subjects that person to electric shock
13 treatment or other electrical therapy including, without limitation, electroconvulsive
14 therapy or transcranial magnet stimulation."

15 AMENDMENT NO. 2

16 On page 5, between lines 11 and 12, insert the following:

17 "(iv) Counseling or other practices that are conducted with the express
18 consent of a patient under the age of eighteen and a parent or tutor of the patient.

19 (v) Counseling or other practices that are neutral with respect to sexual
20 orientation and gender identity.

21 (vi) Counseling or other practices that explore a person's assumptions and
22 goals by permitting the person to decide how to self-identify and live out his sexual
23 orientation or gender identity.

24 (vii) Counseling or other practices that, without an a priori treatment goal,
25 provide acceptance, support, and understanding of a person's sexual orientation
26 identity and gender identity.

27 (viii) Counseling or other practices that discuss with a person his moral or
28 religious beliefs or practices.

29 (ix) Counseling or other practices that provide acceptance, support, and
30 understanding of a person's moral or religious beliefs or practices."
