COURTS/CRIMINAL: Requests a study relative to reporting requirements for active felony cases in each judicial district

1	A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION
2	To urge and request the Judicial Council of the Supreme Court of Louisiana to conduct a
3	comprehensive study of active felony cases in each district court within every
4	judicial district of the state of Louisiana and to report its initial findings to the
5	Legislature of Louisiana prior to the 2023 Regular Session of the Legislature and
6	annually thereafter no later than March 1st of each year.
7	WHEREAS, Louisiana Supreme Court Rule XXII, Section 5(a) provides that a
8	function of the Judicial Council is to continuously study the organization of the courts, the
9	rules, procedures, and practices of the judicial system of the state, as well as of the work
10	accomplished and the results attained by the Judicial Council, and of the uniformity of the
11	exercise of discretionary power of the courts, to the end that procedure may be simplified,
12	business expedited, and justice better administered; and
13	WHEREAS, as national prosecution standards shift, it would be prudent to examine
14	the caseload data from each district court in the state of Louisiana to determine if judicial
15	resources are being used in the most efficient manner possible; and
16	WHEREAS, thousands of criminal cases have been delayed due to the COVID-19
17	pandemic; and
18	WHEREAS, a criminal case has many stages that include but are not limited to
19	arrest, arraignment, evidentiary hearings, trial, appeals, and sentencing, therefore obtaining
20	and studying the caseload and other data may be beneficial to determine the adequacy and
21	efficiency of the judicial system.

1	THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Legislature of Louisiana does hereby
2	urge the Judicial Council to conduct an initial comprehensive study of active felony cases
3	in each district court within every judicial district of the state of Louisiana and to report its
4	initial findings to the Legislature of Louisiana prior to the 2023 Regular Session of the
5	Legislature and annually thereafter no later than March 1st of each year.
6	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that each annual report shall include the following
7	information:
8	(1) The number of active felony criminal cases in each division.
9	(2) For all felony criminal cases filed since January 1, 2020, the percent of cases
10	adjudicated within each of the following time periods:
11	(a) Six months from the date of arraignment.
12	(b) One year from the date of arraignment.
13	(c) Two years from the date of arraignment.
14	(d) Three or more years from the date of arraignment.
15	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a suitable copy of this Resolution be transmitted
16	to the judicial administrator of the Supreme Court of Louisiana for distribution to members
17	of the Judicial Council.
18	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that one print copy and one electronic copy of any
19	report produced pursuant to this Resolution shall be submitted to the David R. Poynter
20	Legislative Research Library as required by R.S. 24:772.
