20	As used in this Chapter, the following terms are defined as and mean the

22	(1) "Commission" means the Louisiana Public Service Commission.
23	(2) "Electric public utility" for the purposes of sale for resale of power
24	related to electric vehicles, or other activities related to operators of electric
25	vehicle equipment, shall be determined by the commission pursuant to its order
26	issued in Docket R-36131.
27	Section 2. This Act shall become effective upon signature of the governor or, if not
28	signed by the governor, upon expiration of the time for bills to become law without signature
29	by the governor, as provided by Article III, Section 18 of the Constitution of Louisiana. If

<u>Proposed law</u> creates the "Electric Vehicle Charging Equipment Network Act" for the purposes of establishing a statewide electric vehicle charging technology and equipment network.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that it is the intent of the legislature that <u>proposed law</u> promotes a rapid development of a statewide electric vehicle charging network.

Proposed law defines "commission" and "electric public utility".

Effective upon signature of the governor or lapse of time for gubernatorial action.
