| 10 | the Mississippi River, the Gulf Intracoastal Waterway, and the Calcasieu Ship Channel; and |
| 11 | WHEREAS, the Mississippi River is the backbone of the nation's water commerce; |

| 13 | WHEREAS, the five ports on the lower Mississippi collectively make up the largest |
| 14 | port complex in the world; and |
| 15 | WHEREAS, more than five million tons of cargo is handled by ports on the lower |
| 16 | Mississippi River annually; and |
| 17 | WHEREAS, more than sixty percent of the nation's grain and twenty percent of |
| 18 | petroleum and energy commodities are handled by Louisiana ports each year; and |
| 19 | WHEREAS, coastal ports support more than ninety percent of the nation's offshore |
| 20 | oil and gas production in the Gulf of Mexico; and |

Requires the subcommittee submit its findings via a report prior to the convening of the 2023 R.S.
