VACCINES/VACCINATION: Prohibits the administration of vaccines to minors on school property and at school-sponsored events unless certain conditions are met

1 AN ACT

2 To enact R.S. 17:170(G), relative to the administration of vaccines; to prohibit the  
3 administration of vaccines to minors on school property and at school-sponsored  
4 events unless certain conditions are met; and to provide for related matters.

5 Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:

6 Section 1. R.S. 17:170(G) is hereby enacted to read as follows:

7 §170. Immunization of persons entering schools, kindergartens, colleges,  
8 proprietary or vocational schools, and day care centers for the first time;  
9 immunization of persons entering sixth grade; electronic transmission of  
10 immunization compliance reports

11 \* \* \*

12 G. No vaccine may be administered to a minor on the property of, or at any  
13 event sponsored by, any education institution or facility enumerated in Subsection  
14 A of this Section unless a healthcare professional is present and parental permission  
15 is obtained through a dual authentication process including both a parental signature  
16 and oral confirmation by a parent either in person or over the telephone. Such  
17 permission may be granted either by the parent or legal guardian, as applicable.

**Abstract:** Prohibits the administration of vaccines to minors on school property and at school-sponsored events unless a healthcare professional is present and parental consent has been granted and authenticated via multiple communication methods.

Present law requires each person entering any school (both public and nonpublic, from daycare through college) for the first time to present satisfactory evidence of immunity to or immunization against vaccine-preventable diseases according to a schedule approved by the office of public health or to present evidence of an immunization program in progress. Exempts students from this requirement upon written dissent or upon a doctor's note relative to medical contraindication.

Proposed law prohibits the administration of vaccines to minors on school property and at school-sponsored events unless a healthcare professional is present and parental permission is obtained through a dual authentication process including both a parental signature and oral confirmation by a parent either in person or over the telephone. Provides that such permission may be granted either by the parent or legal guardian, as applicable.

1. Allow vaccine administration if parental consent has been obtained and verified multiple ways and there is a healthcare professional present.
