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Provides relative to the procurement of internet services and wide area networks services and systems by state agencies

<u>Proposed law</u> removes the exclusive authority of the office of technology services (OTS) or the office of telecommunication to provide internet services and wide area network systems or services. <u>Proposed law</u> removes "wide area network systems and services" from the "telecommunications systems" definition.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that "nothing in the <u>proposed law</u> shall prevent the office of technology service from exercising its authority over information technology security systems."

EXPENDITURE EXPLANATION

<u>Proposed law</u> may result in a net increase in IAT expenditures for state agencies to contract with vendors outside of OTS. OTS anticipates that the fiscal impact on agencies will be SGF and Federal. Based on information provided by OTS, a reduction in operating expenses represents the net impact of removing costs for internet purchase and delivery across the OTS network and replacing them with commercial internet commodity rates. An increase in equipment costs represents the cost of in-network modifications necessary to secure commodity internet traffic from individual locations and maintain compliance with federal regulations, state statutes, and policies. The cost assumes all 950 locations currently utilizing OTS for internet service will need to be updated. OTS reports the following expenditure impact that is spread across five fiscal years.
