CONDOLENCES: Expresses condolences on the death of the Reverend Lionel Johnson, Sr.

A RESOLUTION

2	To express the condolences of the House of Representatives upon the death of the Reverend
3	Lionel Johnson, Sr.
4	WHEREAS, it is with immense sadness and profound regret that the House of
5	Representatives has learned of the death of the Reverend Lionel Johnson, Sr.; and
6	WHEREAS, Reverend Lionel Johnson, Sr., was a native and lifelong resident of
7	Iberville, Louisiana; and
8	WHEREAS, Reverend Johnson received a bachelor's degree in English from
9	Southern University and Agricultural and Mechanical College in Baton Rouge; he received
0	a master's degree in curriculum development from the State University of New York at
1	Albany, and he was an alumnus of the Law Enforcement Basic Training Academy at
12	Louisiana State University; and
13	WHEREAS, Reverend Johnson taught English for eight years in East Feliciana
4	Parish; and
15	WHEREAS, in 1974, Reverend Johnson was appointed by Governor Edwin Edwards
16	to the board of supervisors of the newly formed Southern University system, which at the
17	time included Southern University at Baton Rouge, Southern University at New Orleans, and
18	Southern University at Shreveport; and
19	WHEREAS, Reverend Johnson served ten years as chairman of the board of
20	supervisors and he played a key role in the formation of the Southern University System into
21	the first system of historically black colleges and universities in the nation; and

1	WHEREAS, Reverend Johnson was appointed by Governor Edwin Edwards to serve
2	as a member of the Louisiana Board of Elementary and Secondary Education; and
3	WHEREAS, former governors Edwin Edwards and Dave Treen both appointed
4	Reverend Johnson to serve as a member on the Governor's Special Commission on
5	Educational Services, now the Office of Student Financial Assistance, and Reverend Johnson
6	served as both a member and as the chair; and
7	WHEREAS, Reverend Johnson served twenty-eight years as the chief administrative
8	deputy of the Iberville Parish Sheriff's Office; and
9	WHEREAS, Reverend Johnson founded and served as president of the Iberville
10	Coalition of Black Peace Officers; and
11	WHEREAS, Reverend Johnson served his community in numerous capacities
12	including serving as a member and vice-chair of the Iberville Parish Charter Commission,
13	which developed the Iberville Parish home rule charter in 1996; and
14	WHEREAS, Reverend Johnson was appointed by the Iberville Parish School Board
15	as a member and as chair of the Zero Tolerance Commission; and
16	WHEREAS, Reverend Johnson was a founding member and president of East
17	Iberville Community Complex Incorporated and was instrumental in procuring the defunct
18	Sunshine High School and nearly twenty acres of land to provide community services, and
19	the area is now the site of St. Gabriel City Hall; and
20	WHEREAS, Reverend Johnson was an inaugural alderman for the Town of
21	St. Gabriel; he was initially appointed by Governor Edwin Edwards and he was subsequently
22	elected by the citizens of St. Gabriel and served as an alderman for five years; and
23	WHEREAS, Reverend Johnson was a member and the first black president of the
24	Capital Economic Development District Council, which includes the parishes of Ascension,
25	East Baton Rouge, East Feliciana, Iberville, Livingston, Pointe Coupee, St. Helena,
26	St. Tammany, Tangipahoa, Washington, West Baton Rouge, and West Feliciana; and
27	WHEREAS, Reverend Johnson served as a pastor for more than thirty-six years at
28	three churches: First Mount Carmel Baptist Church in Sunshine, Louisiana; St. Joseph
29	Baptist Church in St. Gabriel, Louisiana; and Greater Ebenezer Baptist Church in
30	Plaquemine, Louisiana; and
