25	promoted to the fourth grade. However, the student shall be provided the opportunity
26	to have the literacy assessment readministered at least once more prior to the start
27	of the next school year. If the student scores above the lowest achievement level on
28	a readministration of the literacy assessment, the student shall be promoted to the
29	fourth grade.
30	(4) Each student who is retained in the third grade due to a reading deficiency
31	shall be provided intensive instructional services throughout the school year and
32	shall be routinely readministered the literacy assessment to monitor his progress
33	toward reaching reading proficiency.
34	(5) The parent or legal guardian of each third grade student who has not met
35	the reading proficiency level required for promotion shall be provided:"
