#### **DIGEST**

<u>Present law</u> (R.S. 15:545) provides for the duty of law enforcement to record the fingerprints of all persons in their custody who have been convicted of any sex offense or any criminal offense against a victim who is a minor for which the penalty of imprisonment might be imposed.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides for the duty of law enforcement to record the fingerprints of all persons arrested for any offense involving the operation of a vehicle while intoxicated, including local ordinances pertaining to operating a motor vehicle while intoxicated. Provides that there shall be no duty to record fingerprints if the fingerprint system at the local prison is unavailable.

<u>Present law</u> (R.S. 15:590) provides for the obtaining and filing of fingerprint and identification data of any person who commits certain offenses.

<u>Proposed law</u> retains <u>present law</u> and expands the list of offenses that involves the operation of a motor vehicle while intoxicated, including local ordinances pertaining to operating a motor vehicle while intoxicated.

## Summary of Amendments Adopted by House

The Committee Amendments Proposed by <u>House Committee on Administration of Criminal Justice</u> to the <u>original</u> bill:
