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SB 439 Reengrossed

2022 Regular Session

<u>Proposed law</u> authorizes the La. State Board of Medical Examiners, referred to hereafter as the "board", to develop, implement, and maintain a program that allows an individual who meets certain criteria as set forth by the board to be certified to practice medicine as a bridge year graduate physician. Provides that such certification shall be valid for one year and may be renewed for no more than two additional one-year periods upon application to the board.

<u>Proposed law</u> requires the board to provide for criteria for participation in the bridge year graduate physician program which, at a minimum, shall require the individual seeking certification to meet the following qualifications:

- (1) He is a graduate of an accredited medical school and is either a resident of Louisiana or trained for at least one year in an accredited medical school located in Louisiana.
- (2) He applied to, but was not accepted into, an accredited medical residency training program for the first year following medical school graduation.

<u>Proposed law</u> requires the board to provide for the prescriptive authority of a bridge year graduate physician including prescribing legend and certain controlled drugs.

<u>Proposed law</u> authorizes the board to suspend, terminate, or revoke a bridge year graduate physician certificate prior to the expiration of its one-year term for any reason provided by <u>present law</u> or <u>present administrative rule</u> for the termination of licenses, permits, registrations, or certificates issued by the board.

<u>Proposed law</u> stipulates that a bridge year graduate physician shall practice only under the direct supervision of a board-certified physician holding a license in good standing with the board.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that after Jan. 1, 2023, healthcare services that are within a bridge year graduate physician's lawful scope of practice and are covered by a health insurance plan shall be reimbursed regardless of whether the services are performed by a physician or a bridge year graduate physician. Further provides that insurance reimbursement to a bridge year graduate physician shall not be less than the reasonable and customary amount of reimbursement that a licensed physician receives for an intermediate office visit or that a primary care physician receives for the same services.

<u>Proposed law</u> requires the La. State Board of Medical Examiners to consult and seek input from the La. State Medical Society, the La. Academy of Family Physicians, a community physician, a medical student who applied to, but was not accepted into, an accredited medical residency training program for the first year following medical school graduation, and a medical student during the development of the bridge year graduate physician program.

## Summary of Amendments Adopted by Senate

# Committee Amendments Proposed by Senate Committee on Health and Welfare to the original bill

- 1. Changes the occupational title <u>from</u> a licensed assistant physician <u>to</u> a certified bridge year graduate physician.
- 2. Provides for certification of bridge year graduate physicians.
- 3. Limits practice to rural or underserved areas.
- 4. Provides for teaching physicians.
- 5. Provides for a sunset date.

### Senate Floor Amendments to engrossed bill

1. Technical amendment only.

# Summary of Amendments Adopted by House

The Committee Amendments Proposed by <u>House Committee on Health and Welfare</u> to the reengrossed bill:

- 1. Delete <u>proposed law</u> relative to bridge year graduate physicians and add in lieu thereof the following provisions:
  - a. Authorization for the La. State Board of Medical Examiners to develop, implement, and maintain a program for certification of bridge year graduate physicians.
  - b. The term of, and provisions for renewal of, bridge year graduate physician certifications.
  - c. Criteria for participation in the bridge year graduate physician program.
  - d. Authorization for the La. State Board of Medical Examiners to provide for the prescriptive authority of bridge year graduate physicians.
  - e. Authorization for the La. State Board of Medical Examiners to suspend, terminate, or revoke bridge year graduate physician certifications for certain causes.
  - f. A requirement that an individual holding a certification to practice as a bridge year graduate physician shall practice only under the direct supervision of a board-certified physician holding a license in good standing.
- 2. Delete proposed law providing for termination of proposed law.
- 3. Require the La. State Board of Medical Examiners to consult and seek input from the La. State Medical Society, the La. Academy of Family Physicians, a community physician, a medical student who applied to, but was not accepted into, an accredited medical residency training program for the first year following medical school graduation, and a medical student during the development of the bridge year graduate physician program authorized by proposed law.
- 4. Make technical changes.
