EXPENDITURE EXPLANATION

There will be an increase in SGF expenditures for the District Attorneys (Budget Unit 20-906) of \$2.6 M in FY 23 and \$2.5 M in FY 24 and future fiscal years. The legislature appropriates funds each year for the salaries for District Attorneys (D.A.) and Assistant District Attorneys (A.D.A.) and the employer contribution for retirement and medicare tax. The payroll expenditures for FY 23 are based upon 27 pay periods. The expenditures for FY 23 are as follows:

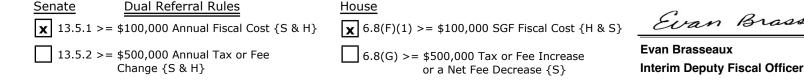

There will be an increase in local expenditures for each District Attorney's office for the cost of group medical benefits, continuing education, bar dues, and other miscellaneous costs. The District Attorney's Association estimates an approximate increase of 30% in expenditures for each local District Attorney office. Actual amounts will vary by district depending on benefit level and are estimated to result in total statewide costs of \$660,000 annually. See below.
