Abstract: Increases the number of tribal officers of the Tunica-Biloxi Tribe of La. that are eligible for supplemental pay from 13 to 20 and provides that the Grand Caillou/Dulac Band of Biloxi-Chitimacha-Choctaw and the Pointe-au-Chien Indian Tribe are formally recognized as Indian Tribes of the state.

<u>Present law</u> provides for supplemental pay of \$500 per month for any full-time police officer paid by any municipality or by the Chitimacha Tribe of La., Coushatta Tribe of La., or the Tunica-Biloxi Tribe of La. that has passed a council-certified training program and completed one year of service.

<u>Present law</u> limits the number of tribal officers from the Chitimacha Tribe, Coushatta Tribe, and the Tunica-Biloxi Tribe that are eligible for supplemental pay.

<u>Proposed law</u> increases the number of eligible tribal officers of the Tunica-Biloxi Tribe from 13 to 20.

<u>Proposed law</u> additionally provides that the Grand Caillou/Dulac Band of Biloxi-Chitimacha-Choctaw and the Pointe-au-Chien Indian Tribe are formally recognized as Indian Tribes of the state.

Effective July 1, 2023.
