- 11 AMENDMENT NO. 4
- 12 On page 1, after line 19, add the following:

13	"§272. Vaccine requirements; exemptions
14	A. An employer that requires a vaccine for an employee shall waive the
15	requirement if the employee, or, if the employee is a minor, the employee's parent
16	or legal guardian, submits either of the following to the employer:
17	(1) A written statement from a physician or signed by a physician stating that
18	receiving the vaccine is contraindicated for medical reasons.
19	(2) A written dissent or statement of a deeply held religious or philosophical
20	belief against receiving the vaccine.
21	B. An employer shall accept exemptions that are allowable under the Civil
22	Rights Act of 1964 and the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990 and offer
23	reasonable accommodations.
24	C. No employer shall discharge any employee or otherwise discriminate
25	against any employee with respect to his compensation, terms, conditions, or
26	privileges of employment because of his refusal to adhere to a vaccine requirement.
27	D. Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, each appropriate
28	state agency shall ensure that a business in this state complies with the provisions of
29	this Section as a condition of obtaining a license or permit for authorization as
30	necessary to conduct business in this state."
