#### Keyword and oneliner of the instrument as it left the House

MEDICAID: Urges and requests the La. Department of Health to utilize increased collections from pharmacy rebates to increase rates for primary care providers in the Medicaid program

## Report adopts Senate amendments to:

- 1. Include pharmacists as providers whose reimbursement rates the La. Dept. of Health is urged to increase using pharmacy rebate proceeds.
- 2. Add findings about the duties, partnership involvement, and fund allocation of pharmacists.

## Report rejects Senate amendments which would have:

1. Specified that base reimbursement rates provided to primary care and pediatric office visit evaluation and management codes may be increased if funds remain available to do so.

# Digest of the bill as proposed by the Conference Committee

Requests the La. Dept. of Health to utilize increased pharmacy rebate collections within the Medicaid program in Fiscal Year 2022-2023 to reimburse pharmacists to acquire prescription drugs and then to increase primary care provider, pharmacist, and pediatric office visit reimbursement rates to levels as provided by Medicare.
