SUMMARY OF HOUSE AMENDMENTS TO THE SENATE BILL

- 1. Deletes <u>proposed law</u> relative to reimbursement of services performed by a physician or bridge year graduate physician.
- 2. Deletes the La. residency criteria requirement for an individual seeking certification in the bridge year graduate physician program.
- 3. Adds a provision authorizing the La. Board of Medical Examiners to determine selection criteria for applicants should the applicants exceed program capacity.
- 4. Provides for compensation of services provided by a bridge year graduate physician.
- 5. Provides for limitations on the certificate to practice as a bridge year graduate physician.
- 6. Makes technical changes.

DIGEST OF THE SENATE BILL AS RETURNED TO THE SENATE

<u>Proposed law</u> authorizes the La. State Board of Medical Examiners, referred to hereafter as the "board", to develop, implement, and maintain a program that allows an individual who meets certain criteria as set forth by the board to be certified to practice medicine as a bridge year graduate physician. Provides that such certification shall be valid for one year and may be renewed for no more than two additional one-year periods upon application to the board.

<u>Proposed law</u> requires the board to provide for criteria for participation in the bridge year graduate physician program which, at a minimum, shall require the individual seeking certification to meet the following qualifications:

- (1) He is a graduate of an accredited medical school.
- (2) He applied to, but was not accepted into, an accredited medical residency training program for the first year following medical school graduation.

<u>Proposed law</u> requires that the board determine criteria for the selection of applicants should the number of applicants exceed the available capacity of the program.

<u>Proposed law</u> requires the board to provide for the prescriptive authority of a bridge year graduate physician including prescribing legend and certain controlled drugs.

<u>Proposed law</u> authorizes the board to suspend, terminate, or revoke a bridge year graduate physician certificate prior to the expiration of its one-year term for any reason provided by <u>present law</u> or <u>present administrative rule</u> for the termination of licenses, permits, registrations, or certificates issued by the board.

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<u>Proposed law</u> stipulates that a bridge year graduate physician shall practice only under the direct supervision of a board-certified physician holding a license in good standing with the board.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that the services provided by an individual holding a certificate to practice as a bridge year graduate physician shall be compensable in accordance with customary medical billing practices.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that issuance of a certificate to practice as a bridge year graduate physician in accordance with the <u>proposed law</u> shall not confer any future right to full, unrestricted licensure.

<u>Proposed law</u> requires the La. State Board of Medical Examiners to consult and seek input from the La. State Medical Society, the La. Academy of Family Physicians, a community physician, a medical student who applied to, but was not accepted into, an accredited medical residency training program for the first year following medical school graduation, and a medical student during the development of the bridge year graduate physician program.
