ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEDURE EN NO IMPACT See Note Page 1 of 1  
 Provides for the reorganization and modernization of the Administrative Procedure Act. (8/1/22)

Proposed law amends, reenacts, enact and recodify portions of the Administrative Procedures Act. Proposed law makes technical updates, provide public hearings, provides for publication of executive orders, directs the Louisiana State Law Institute to redesignate the current provisions of specific law a new format and number scheme, make technical and conforming changes to reflect the format and number scheme provided herein, directs the Louisiana Law Institute to change references to segments of law in existing statutes and codes as necessary to reflect the redesignation of such segments.

Proposed law changes the public hearing timeframe from 35 days to 45 days. Proposed law extends the deadline to five business days.

Proposed law provides if no legislative oversight hearing is to be held, the agency shall send its response to comments or submissions on the rule to any person who presented comments or submission on the rule and to any requesting person not later than 15 days prior to the time of publication of the final rule.

**EXPENDITURE EXPLANATION**
