His career in law enforcement culminated as chief deputy of the Orleans Parish Sheriff's Office, and he would later be known to family and friends as "Chief"; and

WHEREAS, Les was recognized on a much bigger stage when his trained boxers became contenders in title bouts; and

WHEREAS, to honor his contribution to the sport of boxing, Les was selected for induction into the Allstate Sugar Bowl's Greater New Orleans Sports Hall of Fame Class of 2021; and

WHEREAS, Les' talents took him to Hollywood and earned him a small speaking role in the Charles Bronson film, "Hard Times"; and
