## ACT 321 (HB 235)

**McFarland** 

<u>Existing law</u> authorizes parish governing authorities to create hospital service districts. Provides generally that such a district is governed by a five-member board of commissioners. Provides that commissioners are appointed by the parish governing authority and requires that they be qualified voters and residents of the district.

<u>Prior law</u> provided that the Jackson Parish Hospital Service District was governed by a seven-member board of commissioners. <u>New law</u> provides that the district is governed by a five-member board of commissioners.

<u>New law</u> requires that the members of the board of commissioners of the Jackson Parish Hospital District meet certain qualifications as follows:

- (1) One commissioner shall be an officer or owner of a bank or group of banks in the parish.
- (2) One commissioner shall be a licensed attorney who is not employed by the district attorney's office.
- One commissioner shall be a licensed healthcare professional who practices at the hospital service district hospital.
- (4) One commissioner shall be a licensed certified public accountant or hold a master's degree in business administration.
- (5) One commissioner shall possess managerial expertise and be employed by a manufacturer located in the parish that has more than 200 employees and that manufactures products made from pulp wood or other fibrous materials.

<u>New law</u> repeals <u>prior law</u> that provided relative to the governance of a hospital service district in any parish with a population between 16,000 and 17,000. <u>Prior law</u> provided similarly to new law regarding qualifications of commissioners.

Effective upon signature of governor (June 10, 2022).
