PORTS/HARBORS/TERMINALS. Provides relative to per diem received by commissioners of the Vinton Harbor and Terminal District. (8/1/23)

AN ACT

2 To amend and reenact R.S. 34:334.12, relative to the Vinton Harbor and Terminal District; to provide for the per diem received by commissioners of the district; and to provide 3 for related matters. 4 5 Notice of intention to introduce this Act has been published. 6 Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana: Section 1. R.S. 34:334.12 is hereby amended and reenacted to read as follows: 8 §334.12. Per diem of commissioners 9 The commissioners shall be paid a per diem not to exceed seventy dollars one 10 hundred forty dollars and the duly elected president shall be paid a per diem not 11 to exceed two hundred fifty dollars one thousand dollars for each day of attendance at meetings of the commission or on business of the commission authorized by the 12 13 board. The board shall establish the per diem rates. The number of days such per diem shall be paid shall not exceed twelve days in any one calendar year. Any 14 commissioner, including the president, shall only be eligible to receive a per 15 16 diem for up to twelve days in a calendar year.

<u>Present law</u> provides for a per diem of \$70.00 for commissioners and \$250.00 for the president of the Vinton Harbor and Terminal District for each day of attendance at meetings of the commission or on business of the commission authorized by the board, not to exceed 12 days in any calendar year.

<u>Proposed law retains present law and increases the per diem for commissioners from \$70.00 to a maximum of \$140.00 for commissioners.</u>

<u>Proposed law</u> increases the per diem <u>from</u> \$250.00 <u>to</u> a maximum of \$1,000.00 for the president.

Proposed law makes technical changes.

Effective August 1, 2023.
