



**PUBLIC NOTICE**

(NOTICE OF INTENTION TO INTRODUCE LOCAL BILL - HLS 23RS-331)

Public notice is hereby given, as provided by Section 13, Article III of the Constitution of Louisiana, that there will be introduced at the forthcoming session of the Legislature of Louisiana, to be convened on April 10, 2023, a bill relative to Orleans Parish; to provide relative to the Mid-City Security District; to provide relative to district funding; to provide relative to the imposition and collection of a parcel fee in the district; to provide for the levy of a parcel fee, subject to voter approval, as follows: a maximum parcel fee of \$250 per year for each residential parcel which is unimproved, or contains a single family dwelling, townhouse, or two family dwellings; a maximum of \$300 per year for each residential parcel which contains three or four family dwellings; a maximum of \$600 per year for each residential parcel which contains five to nine rental units; a maximum of \$1000 per year for each residential parcel which contains 10 to 19 rental units; a maximum of \$2000 per year for each residential parcel which contains 20 to 39 rental units; a maximum of \$4000 per year for each residential parcel which contains 40 or more rental units; a maximum of \$150 per year for residential parcels subject to a special assessment level pursuant to La. Const. Article VII, Section 18(G); and a maximum of \$500 per year for commercial parcels; to authorize the district to change the fee, without election, not to exceed the maximum amount; and to provide for related matters.
