AN ACT

2	To enact R.S. 17:351.1(C)(3)(d), relative to textbooks and other instructional materials; to
3	provide regarding the determination of the quality of textbooks and other

5	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
6	Section 1. R.S. 17:351.1(C)(3)(d) is hereby enacted to read as follows:
7	§351.1. Textbooks and other instructional materials; review; adoption;
8	procurement; distribution

11	(3) * * *
12	(d) If the governing authority of a public elementary or secondary school
13	conducts a review of textbooks or other instructional materials and determines
14	the textbooks or other instructional materials are of high quality, the state
15	Department of Education shall recognize the determination for all purposes,
16	including funding eligibility.

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Section 2. This Act shall become effective upon signature by the governor or, if not signed by the governor, upon expiration of the time for bills to become law without signature by the governor, as provided by Article III, Section 18 of the Constitution of Louisiana. If vetoed by the governor and subsequently approved by the legislature, this Act shall become effective on the day following such approval.

SB 46 Original

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<u>Present law</u> provides for roles and responsibilities of the State Board of Elementary and Secondary Education (BESE), the Louisiana Department of Education (LDOE), and governing authority of local public school systems in the review, adoption, and procurement of textbooks and instructional materials. Further provides for the local public schools to review and adopt textbooks and instructional materials not reviewed by LDOE.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that if a governing authority reviews textbooks or instructional materials that have not been reviewed by LDOE and determines the textbooks or instructional materials are of high quality, the LDOE shall recognize the determination for all purposes, including funding eligibility.

Effective upon signature of the governor or lapse of time for gubernatorial action.
