PROPERTY/EXPROPRIATION: Provides for the expropriation of property by a declaration of taking by certain political subdivisions of Calcasieu Parish

2	To amend and reenact the heading of Part III-E of Title 19 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes	
3	of 1950 and R.S. 19:134 and 134.1, relative to expropriation; to provide for the	
4	acquisition of property for the cities of Lake Charles and Sulphur; to provide for the	
5	appropriation authority by the Consolidated Gravity Drainage Districts of Calcasieu	
6	Parish; to provide for limitations; to provide for definitions; and to provide for	
7	related matters.	
8	Notice of intention to introduce this Act has been published	
9	as provided by Article III, Section 13 of the Constitution of

11	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:	
12	Section 1. The heading of Part III-E of Title 19 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes	
13	of 1950 and R.S. 19:134 and 134.1 are hereby amended and reenacted to read as follows:	
14	PART III-E. EXPROPRIATION OF PROPERTY BY	
15	A DECLARATION OF TAKING BY PARISH OF CALCASIEU,	
16	AND THE CITY CITIES OF LAKE CHARLES AND SULPHUR, AND

18	§134. Property, governing authority defined	
19	As used in this Part, the term "property" means any portion of immovable	
20	property, including servitudes, rights-of-way, and other rights in or to immovable

4	§134.1. Authority to expropriate; acquisition of property for street, drainage, water,
5	utility, or sewerage projects prior to judgment
6	A.(1) When the governing authority cannot amicably acquire property
7	needed by the parish of Calcasieu or, the city cities of Lake Charles and Sulphur, or
8	the Consolidated Gravity Drainage Districts of Calcasieu Parish for a street,
9	drainage, water, utility, or sewerage project, it may acquire the same by
10	expropriation and may acquire the property prior to judgment in the trial court fixing
11	the amount of compensation due to the owner of the property.
12	(2) The Consolidated Gravity Drainage Districts of Calcasieu Parish may
13	utilize the provisions of this Section in the same manner as the parish of Calcasieu
14	only when expressly authorized for a particular project and property pursuant to a
15	cooperative endeavor agreement adopted by the governing authority of the parish of
16	Calcasieu or the governing authority of a city where a property is located entirely
17	within that city. Any references in this Section to a director of public works shall be
18	the employee designated by the governing authority for this purpose, and any
19	references in this Section to a city or parish engineer shall mean the professional
20	engineer designated by the governing authority for this purpose.

Abstract: Provides for the expropriation of property in Lake Charles and Sulphur by the Consolidated Gravity Drainage Districts of Calcasieu Parish.

<u>Present law</u> (R.S. 19:134) provides for the expropriation of property by a declaration of taking by Calcasieu Parish and the city of Lake Charles.

<u>Present law</u> defines "governing authority" to include Calcasieu Parish and the city of Lake Charles.

Proposed law expands present law to include the city of Sulphur.

<u>Present law</u> (R.S. 19:134.1) provides for the authority of Calcasieu Parish and the city of Lake Charles to expropriate property for street, drainage, water, utility, or sewerage projects prior to judgment.

<u>Proposed law</u> expands <u>present law</u> to include the city of Sulphur and the Consolidated Gravity Drainage Districts of Calcasieu Parish.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that the Consolidated Gravity Drainage Districts of Calcasieu Parish may only utilize <u>proposed law</u> if expressly authorized for a particular project by the governing authority of Calcasieu Parish or the governing authority of a city where a property is located entirely within that city.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that any references to the director of public works within <u>proposed</u> <u>law</u> shall be an employee designated by the governing authority for this purpose. <u>Proposed</u> <u>law</u> further provides that any references to a city or parish engineer shall mean a the professional engineer designated by the governing authority for this purpose.
