1	AN ACT
2	To amend and reenact R.S. 17:263(A), 264(A)(1), 266, 267(A), 271(A), 273(C), 274, 274.1(A),
3	279(A), 281(A)(1)(a) and (G), 351.1(B)(3)(d)(i), 377, 381, and 416.21(N)(3)(b)(ii), to
4	enact R.S. 17:264(C), and to repeal R.S. 17:253 and 274.1(B)(2) and (D)(2)(b),
5	relative to the administration of public schools; to provide relative to required
6	instruction in public schools; to abolish the Advisory Council on Student Behavior
7	and Discipline; to provide relative to donations to schools; to provide relative to the
8	diploma endorsement program for the performance of community service by high
9	school students; to provide relative to textbooks and other instructional materials; to
10	provide relative to the Quality Science and Mathematics Program; to provide for
11	effectiveness; and to provide for related matters.
12	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
13	Section 1. This Act shall be known and may be cited as the "Louisiana Teachers'
14	Relief and Education Reform and School District Reform Act".
15	Section 2. R.S. 17:263(A), 264(A)(1), 267(A), 271(A), 273(C), 274, 274.1(A),
16	279(A), 281(A)(1)(a) and (G), 351.1(B)(3)(d)(i), 377, 381, and 416.21(N)(3)(b)(ii) are
17	hereby amended and reenacted and R.S. 17:264(C) is hereby enacted to read as follows:
18	§263. Adoption awareness; required instruction
19	A. Adoption awareness shall be required instruction for high school students
20	in public and nonpublic secondary schools in a manner deemed appropriate by the

1	school principal. However, the superintendent of a school district or his designee
2	may waive the requirements of this Section for any school year if the instruction
3	required by this Section will impede on instructional time for English language arts,
4	mathematics, science, or social studies. The superintendent shall maintain
5	documentation of such waiver.

7	§264. Community service; high school diploma endorsement program
8	A.(1) The State Board of Elementary and Secondary Education may
9	establish a "Distinction for Community Service" diploma endorsement program to
10	recognize high school students who perform a certain number of hours of
11	documented community service. Community service hours shall not count toward
12	academic course work or graded work in any public school. The number of service
13	hours required to earn a diploma endorsement shall be determined by the state board
14	and shall accrue from the ninth grade through the twelfth grade.

16	C. The community service performed pursuant to this Section shall not be
17	related to political activities of any kind.

19	§267. Litter prevention and awareness; required instruction
20	A. Instruction in litter prevention and awareness shall be provided to each
21	public school student in kindergarten through grade five. Such instruction shall be
22	integrated into the existing curriculum and may include instructional materials
23	created and developed for students in Louisiana to assist such students in making
24	environmentally sound decisions and understanding the vital role they play in
25	preserving the beauty of the state. However, the superintendent of a school district
26	or his designee may waive the requirements of this Section for any school year if the
27	instruction required by this Section will impede on instructional time for English

1	language arts, mathematics, science, or social studies. The superintendent shall
2	maintain documentation of such waiver.

4	§271. Shaken baby syndrome; instruction
5	A. Each public high school shall provide instruction in the recognition and
6	prevention of shaken baby syndrome. Such instruction shall be integrated into an
7	existing course of study. However, the superintendent of a school district or his
8	designee may waive the requirements of this Section for any school year if the
9	instruction required by this Section will impede on instructional time for English
10	language arts, mathematics, science, or social studies. The superintendent shall
11	maintain documentation of such waiver.

13	§273. Second languages; teaching in public schools
14	* * *
15	C. The State Board of Elementary and Secondary Education shall establish
16	guidelines, regulations, and policies for the implementation of a comprehensive
17	curriculum statewide standard in a second language in a well articulated sequential
18	manner in order to carry out the intent of this Section.

20	§274. Free enterprise; elective course
21	Public high schools may give instruction in an elective course in free
22	enterprise in accordance with a course of study prescribed by the State Board of
23	Elementary and Secondary Education for at least one semester, equal to one-half unit
24	of credit. The State Board of Elementary and Secondary Education shall prescribe
25	suitable teaching materials for the instruction.
26	§274.1. Civics and Free Enterprise; required; exceptions
27	A. Except as provided in Subparagraph (B)(1)(b) of this Section, all public
28	high schools shall give instruction in Civics and Free Enterprise as a prerequisite to
29	graduation. Instruction shall be given in accordance with the course of study

1	prescribed by the State Board of Elementary and Secondary Education as provided
2	in this Section. The State Board of Elementary and Secondary Education shall
3	prescribe suitable teaching materials for the instruction.

5	§279. Parenthood education; required course
6	A.(1) All public high schools offering home economics programs shall
7	provide instruction in parenthood education. However, the superintendent of a
8	school district or his designee may waive the requirements of this Section for any
9	school year if the instruction required by this Section will impede on instructional
10	time for English language arts, mathematics, science, or social studies. The
11	superintendent shall maintain documentation of such waiver.
12	(2) All other public high schools may provide instruction in parenthood
13	education.

15	§281. Instruction in sex education
16	A.(1)(a) Any public elementary or secondary school in Louisiana may, but
17	is not required to, offer instruction in subject matter designated as "sex education",
18	provided such instruction and subject matter is integrated into an existing course of
19	study such as biology, science, physical hygiene, or physical education. When
20	offered, such instruction shall be available also to nongraded special education
21	students at age-appropriate levels. Except as otherwise required to comply with the
22	provisions of Subparagraph (b) of this Paragraph, whether or not instruction in such
23	matter is offered and at what grade level it is to be offered shall be at the option of
24	each public local or parish school board, provided that no such instruction shall be
25	offered in kindergarten or in grades one through six. Such instruction may be
26	offered at times other than during the regular school day, at such times to be
27	determined by each school board. All instruction in "sex education" shall be
28	identified and designated "sex education".

1	G. A city or parish school system may accept federal funds for programs
2	offering sex education only when the use of such funds does not violate the
3	provisions of this Section and only upon approval by the local school board. The use
4	of such funds shall be approved annually by the school board in a public meeting at
5	a time and place advertised by the school board at least two weeks prior to the
6	meeting. The acceptance and use of federal funds for sex education shall in no way
7	be construed to permit the use of any federally supplied materials that violate
8	Louisiana law regulating sex education.

10	§351.1. Textbooks and other instructional materials; review; adoption; procurement;
11	distribution

15	(3) The review process shall, at a minimum, provide for the following:

17	(d)(i) The opportunity for parents and the public to view and submit
18	comments on all textbooks and instructional materials under review. A copy of all
19	student edition textbooks and instructional materials under review shall be made
20	readily available online and in-person for this purpose. Reasonable safeguards
21	against unauthorized use, reproduction, and distribution shall be provided.

23	§377. Quality Science and Mathematics Program; oversight
24	A. The activities of the council and the implementation of the program $\frac{1}{1000}$
25	shall be reviewed by the House Committee on Education and the Senate Committee
26	on Education and the rules and regulations shall be subject to review as provided by
27	the Administrative Procedure Act.

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1	§381. Acceptance of donations by state and parish school boards
2	The state board of education State Board of Elementary and Secondary
3	Education and the several parish school boards may, any school board, in accordance
4	with the provisions of this Part, <u>may</u> accept and administer any donation that may be
5	made to them for educational or literary purposes, and each board shall enumerate
6	details of the contents of such donations in a document made publicly available on
7	its website.

22	Section 3. R.S. 17:266 is hereby amended and reenacted to read as follows:
23	§266. Cursive writing; required instruction
24	<u>A.</u> Cursive writing shall be taught in all public schools. Each public school
25	shall ensure that such instruction is introduced by the third grade and incorporated
26	into the curriculum in grades four through twelve.
27	B. Each public school governing authority shall provide a written report to
28	the state Department of Education each school year confirming the instruction of
29	cursive writing as provided by this Section. The department shall compile the

1	reports and submit a compiled report to the legislature no later than July thirty-first
2	of each calendar year.
3	Section 4. R.S. 17:253 and 274.1(B)(2) and (D)(2)(b) are hereby repealed in their
4	entirety.
5	Section 5.(A) The provisions of Sections 1, 3, and 4 and this Section of this Act shall
6	be effective on August 1, 2023.
7	(B) The provisions of Section 2 of this Act shall become effective on January 1,
8	2024.

HB 315 Original 2023 Regular Session

Abstract: Provides relative to public school administration.

<u>Present law</u> (R.S. 17:264) authorizes the State Bd. of Elementary and Secondary Education (BESE) to establish a "Distinction for Community Service" diploma endorsement program for high school students who perform community service. <u>Proposed law</u> retains <u>present law</u> but prohibits the following:

(1) Students from receiving academic credit for community service.

(2) Political activity from qualifying as community service for purposes of <u>present law</u>.

<u>Present law</u> (R.S. 17:266) requires that cursive writing be taught in all public schools, including charter schools. <u>Proposed law</u> retains <u>present law</u> and additionally requires each public school governing authority to report to the state Dept. of Education (DOE) relative to the implementation of <u>present law</u>. Further requires DOE to submit a cumulative report to the legislature by July 31st each year.

<u>Present law</u> (R.S. 17:274) provides for an elective course for public high school students in free enterprise. <u>Present law</u> (R.S. 17:274.1) requires all public high schools to provide instruction in Civics and Free Enterprise as a prerequisite to graduation. <u>Proposed law</u> retains <u>present law</u>. <u>Present law</u> requires BESE to prescribe suitable teaching materials for such instruction. <u>Proposed law</u> removes this requirement.

<u>Present law</u> (R.S. 17:281) authorizes any public elementary or secondary school to offer instruction in sex education, provided such instruction is integrated into an existing course of study such as biology, science, physical hygiene, or physical education. <u>Proposed law</u> retains <u>present law</u> but removes authorization for instruction to be offered in public elementary schools. <u>Present law</u> authorizes instruction to be offered at times other than during the regular school day. <u>Proposed law</u> removes this authorization. <u>Present law</u> authorizes a city or parish school system to accept federal funds for programs offering sex education upon approval by the local school board. <u>Proposed law</u> retains <u>present law</u> and additionally requires the school board to approve the funds on an annual basis in a public meeting at a time and place advertised by the school board at least two weeks prior to the

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meeting.

<u>Present law</u> (R.S. 17:377) authorizes the activities of the Quality Science and Mathematics Council (R.S. 17:374) and the implementation of the program to be reviewed by the legislative education committees. <u>Proposed law</u> requires, instead of authorizes, such review. <u>Proposed law</u> otherwise retains <u>present law</u>.

<u>Present law</u> (R.S. 17:253) creates the Advisory Council on Student Behavior and Discipline to provide advice and guidance to BESE and DOE regarding best practices in providing support to public school governing authorities in the adoption and implementation of each school's master plan for student behavior and discipline as provided in <u>present law</u> (R.S. 17:252). <u>Proposed law</u> abolishes the council.

<u>Present law</u> requires instruction in adoption awareness (R.S. 17:263), litter prevention and awareness (R.S. 17:267), shaken baby syndrome (R.S. 17:271), and parenthood education (R.S. 17:279). <u>Proposed law</u> retains <u>present law</u> and additionally authorizes a superintendent or his designee to waive the requirement if the instruction would impede on instructional time for English language arts, mathematics, science, or social studies.

<u>Present law</u> provides relative to public review of textbooks. Requires that student editions of textbooks be made available online. <u>Proposed law</u> requires all editions of textbooks be made available online and in-person.

<u>Present law</u> authorizes BESE and school boards to accept donations for educational and literary purposes. <u>Proposed law</u> requires such boards to make details of such donations available on their websites.

Effective in part August 1, 2023; effective in part January 1, 2024.
