ELECTIONS/POLLING PLACES: Authorizes persons and organizations engaging in lawful nonpartisan activities to remain within six hundred feet of the entrance of a polling location

1 AN ACT

To amend and reenact R.S. 18:1462(A)(2) and (C), relative to prohibited acts during early voting or on election day; to provide exceptions; to authorize certain persons to remain withing the six hundred foot campaign-free zone around polling places; and to provide for related matters.

6 Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:

7 Section 1. R.S. 18:1462(A)(2) and (C) are hereby amended and reenacted to read as

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§1462. Acts prohibited during early voting or on election day; electioneering; intimidation; exceptions; enforcement; penalties

A. The Legislature of Louisiana recognizes that the right to vote is a right that is essential to the effective operation of a democratic government. In order to preserve the integrity of its election process, and to protect the right of citizens to vote freely for the candidates of their choice, the state has a compelling interest in establishing a zone securing polling locations against certain conduct and activities, including voter intimidation, election fraud, confusion, and general disorder, that would interfere with the exercise of the right to vote. The legislature, therefore, enacts this Subsection to provide for a six hundred foot campaign-free zone around polling places to provide to each voter such an environment in which to exercise his

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right to vote. Except as otherwise specifically provided by law, it shall be unlawful for any person, between the hours of 6:00 a.m. and 9:00 p.m., to perform or cause to be performed any of the following acts within any polling place being used in an election on election day or during early voting, or within a radius of six hundred feet of the entrance to any polling place being used in an election on election day or during early voting:

(2) To remain within any such polling place or within a radius of six hundred feet of the entrance of any such polling place, except when exercising the right to vote or engaging in other lawful activities, after having been directed by an election commissioner, law enforcement officer, registrar, or deputy registrar to leave the premises or area of a polling place.

C. The provisions of this Section shall not be construed as prohibiting any appointed election commissioner or any official watcher from remaining in and about the polling place in which he was selected to serve or as prohibiting any person or organization from engaging in nonpartisan activities that do not otherwise violate any provision of this Section, any other state law, or federal law within a radius of six hundred feet of the entrance to any polling place being used in an election on election day or during early voting.

**Abstract:** Authorizes a person or organization engaging in lawful nonpartisan activities to remain within a 600 - foot radius of the entrance to any polling place being used in an election on election day or during early voting.

<u>Present law</u> provides that to preserve the integrity of the election process, and to protect the right of citizens to vote freely for the candidates of their choice, the state has a compelling interest in establishing a zone securing polling locations against certain conduct and

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activities, including voter intimidation, election, fraud, confusion, and general disorder, that would interfere with the exercise of the right to vote. Further specifically prohibits certain acts between the hours of 6:00 a.m. and 9:00 p.m. within any polling place being used in an election on election day or during early voting, or within a radius of 600 feet of the entrance to any polling place being used in an election on election day or during early voting including remaining within any such polling place or within a radius of 600 feet of the entrance of any such polling place, except when exercising the right to vote, after having been directed by an election commissioner, law enforcement officer, registrar, or deputy registrar to leave the premises or area of a polling place.

Proposed law provides an additional exception for engaging in other lawful activities.

<u>Present law</u> provides that the provisions of <u>present law</u> shall not be construed as prohibiting an election commissioner or official watcher from remaining in and about the polling place in which he was selected serve.

<u>Proposed law</u> further provides that the provisions of <u>present law</u> shall not be construed as prohibiting any person or organization from engaging in nonpartisan activities that do not otherwise violate <u>present law</u>, any other state law, or federal law within a radius of 600 feet of the entrance to any polling place being used in an election on election day or during early voting.
