12	(3) For the purpose of this Section, "third-party solution" shall mean a
13	company that any of the following:
14	(a) A company that provides a software application, a gateway, or both to
15	capture credit card and any other forms of electronic payments for processing by a

Abstract: Provides for convenience fees for use of electronic signatures.

<u>Present law</u> provides that the state may accept credit or debit cards for the payment of taxes, fees, licenses, fines, penalties, interest, etc. Provides for a convenience fee for the use of a card for payment. Provides for the convenience fee to be charged by a third-party solution and paid by the consumer, upon the consumer's approval.

<u>Proposed law</u> retains <u>present law</u> and adds convenience fees for the use of electronic signatures or authorizations to be charged by a third-party solution and paid by the consumer, upon the consumer's approval.
