<u>Present law</u> known commonly as the cottage food law exempts home-based preparers of certain foods for sale from <u>present law</u> and present administrative rule relative to preparation of food for public consumption if the preparer's gross annual sales of such foods are less than \$20,000 and certain other conditions are met. <u>Proposed law</u> retains <u>present law</u> and creates the Louisiana Small Wild Catfish Processor's Act, which provides an exemption for the preparation of wild catfish for direct sale to the consuming public.

<u>Proposed law</u> does not apply if any individual is employed to assist in the preparation of the wild catfish for sale. <u>Proposed law</u> further provides for restrictions, conditions, and requirements applicable to the preparation of wild catfish for direct sale to the consuming public.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that no individual who prepares wild catfish for direct sale to the consuming public pursuant to <u>proposed law</u> shall sell more than 400 pounds of wild catfish per month or sell the processed wild catfish to any retail business or individual for resale.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides for labeling requirements, tax collection requirements, and licensure requirements.
