AN ACT

2 To enact R.S. 4:707.1, relative to charitable gaming; to provide for limited raffle licenses for 3 certain raffle games; to provide relative to the promulgation of rules for limited raffle 4 licenses; and to provide for related matters. 5 Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana: 6 Section 1. R.S. 4:707.1 is hereby enacted to read as follows: 7 §707.1. Limited raffle licenses 8 Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, there shall be a limited 9 raffle license for certain raffle games. The office shall promulgate rules relative to 10 the issuance of such limited raffle licenses which shall include but not be limited to 11 licensing fees and reporting requirements. The provisions of R.S. 4:705(2)(c) and 714(F)(1) shall not apply to any limited raffle license issued pursuant to the 12 13 provisions of this Section.

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**Abstract:** Relative to charitable gaming, establishes a limited raffle license for certain raffle games.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides for a limited raffle license for certain raffle games. Requires the office of charitable gaming within the Dept. of Revenue to promulgate rules relative to the

issuance of such licenses. The rules shall include but not be limited to licensing fees and reporting requirements.

<u>Proposed law</u> further provides that the provisions of <u>present law</u> (R.S. 4:705(2)(c) and 714(F)(1)), relative to the establishment, assessment, and collection of certain fees and proceeds from gaming sessions deposited into a bank account, shall not apply to any limited license issued pursuant to <u>proposed law</u>.
