Prefiled pursuant to Article III, Section 2(A)(4)(b)(i) of the Constitution of Louisiana. COURTS: Provides relative to marshals and constables

1	AN ACT
2	To amend and reenact R.S. 13:1879 and 2583.1(C), relative to certain marshals and
3	constables of city courts; to provide relative to elections and designations of
4	marshals and constables; to provide for the designation of the marshal of the city of
5	Sulphur; to provide relative to qualifications of deputy constables; and to provide for
6	related matters.
7	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
8	Section 1. R.S. 13:1879 and 2583.1(C) are hereby amended and reenacted to read
9	as follows:
10	§1879. Marshals and constables; election; term of office; exceptions for Lake
11	Charles and Baton Rouge
12	A.(1) For Except as provided in Subsection B of this Section, for each city
13	court <del>, except in the city of Lake Charles,</del> there shall be a marshal or constable, as he
14	may be designated. Except as provided in Subsection C Paragraph (B)(1) of this
15	Section, each marshal or constable shall be elected at the congressional election,
16	beginning in the year 1960 and every succeeding six years thereafter, shall serve a
17	term of six years, and shall take office and begin his term on the first day of January
18	following election. In the city of Lake Charles, the marshal shall be designated as
19	the ward three marshal.

1	B:(2) Except as provided in Sub-section C Paragraph (B)(1) of this Section,		
2	the term of office of marshals of city courts, whether their respective offices are		
3	presently in existence or are subsequently created shall expire on the 31st day of		
4	December in the year 1960 and every six years thereafter.		
5	C.B.(1) The city constable of the city of Baton Rouge shall be elected in		
6	accordance with and pursuant to the applicable provisions of the charter of the city		
7	of Baton Rouge and the applicable provisions of the plan of government for the		
8	parish of East Baton Rouge and the city of Baton Rouge.		
9	(2) In the city of Lake Charles, the marshal shall be designated as the ward		
10	three marshal.		
11	(3) In the city of Sulphur, the marshal shall be designated as the ward four		
12	marshal.		
13	<del>D.C.</del> Except as otherwise provided by law, the provisions of this Part relating		
14	to marshals of city courts and their deputies shall apply to constables of city courts		
15	and their deputies.

19	C. The deputy constables authorized by this Section shall have the same		
20	qualifications and training as required by law of the constable of the justice of the		
21	peace court. The deputy constable need not be a resident of the ward from which the		
22	constable is elected, but he must be a resident of the parish within which the ward		
23	is located this state.

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Abstract: Provides relative to the designation of the marshal of the city court of Sulphur and qualifications of deputy constables.

<u>Present law</u> provides that a marshal or constable, except the marshal of the city court of Lake Charles, may be designated for each city court.

<u>Proposed law</u> adds an exception for the marshal of the city of Sulphur and designates the marshal as the ward four marshal.

<u>Present law</u> provides that a deputy constable must be a resident of the parish within which the elected constable's ward is located.

<u>Proposed law</u> changes the requirement that the deputy constable be a resident of the parish within which the elected constable's ward is located and requires the deputy constable to be a resident of this state.

Summary of Amendments Adopted by House

The Committee Amendments Proposed by <u>House Committee on Judiciary</u> to the <u>original</u> bill:

- 1. Remove provisions which provide for the compensation of certain marshals and constables.
- 2. Change <u>from</u> the requirement that the deputy constable be a resident of the parish within which the elected constable's ward is located <u>to</u> the requirement that the deputy constable be a resident of this state.
