SB 63 Reengrossed

## 2023 Regular Session

Mizell

<u>Present constitution</u> provides that no law shall be enacted respecting an establishment of religion or prohibiting the free exercise thereof.

<u>Proposed constitutional amendment</u> provides that the freedom to worship in a church or other place of worship is a fundamental right that is worthy of the highest order of protection.

<u>Proposed constitutional amendment</u> retains <u>present constitution</u> and clarifies that <u>proposed</u> <u>constitutional amendment</u> is not intended to alter or limit the free exercise of religion guaranteed in the <u>present constitution</u>.

<u>Proposed constitutional amendment</u> further provides that if the state or local government acts in a manner contrary to the <u>proposed constitutional amendment</u>, a court hearing the challenge to that governmental action is to apply the standard of strict scrutiny, unless a higher level of protection is recognized and applied by the court.

Specifies submission of the amendment to the voters at the statewide election to be held on October 14, 2023.
