20-950 JUDGMENTS

Notwithstanding the provisions of R.S. 49:112, the sum of \$12,500,000 or so much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated out of the State General Fund (Direct) for Fiscal Year 2022-2023 to be allocated to pay consent judgments and other final judgments against the state, Board of Tax Appeals judgments and recommendations for payment of a claim against the state, and reimbursements of attorney fees, all as provided in this Section. A judgment or recommendation may only be paid from this appropriation if it is final. All judgments and recommendations provided for in this Section shall be paid as to principal, interest, court costs, and expert witness fees as awarded in each judgment or recommendation, it being the intent herein that when the provisions of a judgment or recommendation conflict with the provisions of this Act, the provisions of the judgment or recommendation shall be controlling. Any other provision of this Act not in conflict with the provisions of a judgment or recommendation shall control. Payment shall be made as to each judgement, Board of Tax Appeals judgment or recommendation, or reimbursement for attorney fees only after presentation to the state treasurer of documentation required by the state treasurer. Further, all judgments and recommendations provided for in this Section shall be deemed to have been paid on the effective date of the Act, and interest shall cease to run as of that date.

Appropriates supplemental funding and provides for means of finance substitutions and other budgetary adjustments for Fiscal Year 2022-2023. Provides for net increases (decreases) as follows: State General Fund (Direct) by \$203,373,198, Interagency Transfers by \$35,264,791, Fees & Self-generated Revenues by \$13,553,636, Statutory Dedications by (\$117,379,862), and Federal Funds by \$3,637,448.

Additionally appropriates \$319,286,662 of State General Fund (Direct) of nonrecurring revenue out of the surplus from Fiscal Year 2021-2022 for the Initial Unfunded Accrued Liability in state retirement systems.

Effective upon signature of the governor or lapse of time for gubernatorial action.

Summary of Amendments Adopted by House

The Committee Amendments Proposed by <u>House Committee on Appropriations</u> to the <u>original</u> bill:
