1 AMENDMENT NO. 1

- On page 1, line 9, after "records;" and before "to provide" insert "to provide relative to the
 collection of data regarding jail facilities;"
- 4 AMENDMENT NO. 2
- 5 On page 5, between lines 11 and 12, insert the following:

6	"G. For purposes of this pilot program, the keeper of the Jefferson Parish jail
7	facility shall keep and maintain a daily record of the following data:
8	(1) For each confined inmate:
9	(a) The date of entrance.
10	(b) Name.
11	(c) Date of birth.
12	(d) Race, ethnicity, and gender.
13	(e) Any criminal charges against the inmate, organized by code section, and
14	the jurisdiction charging each offense.
15	(f) Term of sentence, if sentenced.
16	(g) Bond amount, if bond has been set.
17	(h) Release date.
18	(i) If the inmate is in the legal custody of a jurisdiction other than the parish
19	where the jail facility is located, the jurisdiction having legal custody of the inmate.
20	(2) The maximum design capacity of the jail.
21	(3) The name of the jail management system used by the jail facility.
22	(4) The number of confined inmates in the jail facility.
23	(5) Counting each confined inmate only once, the following information
24	concerning confined inmates:
25	(a) The number of sentenced inmates.
26	(b) The number of unsentenced inmates with a hold.
27	(c) The number of unsentenced inmates without a hold.
28	(6) Counting each unsentenced inmate without a hold only once, the
29	following information concerning unsentenced inmates:
30	(a) The number whose most serious charged offense is a felony.
31	(b) The number whose most serious charged offense is a misdemeanor.
32	(7) The number of confined inmates held only for a municipal offense.
33	(8) The average number of confined inmates held in administrative
34	segregation or other custody level in which the inmate is allowed outside of his cell
35	for two or fewer hours per day and:
36	(a) The average number of confined inmates who were placed in
37	administrative segregation and the average number of offenders who were released
38	from administrative segregation.
39	(b) The age, sex, race, ethnicity, mental health code, medical class code,
40	security level, and custody level of classification of each confined inmate.
41	(c) The disciplinary offense history of an inmate preceding his placement in
42	administrative segregation.
43	(d) The average number of days each inmate spent in restrictive housing.

1	(e) The average number of incidents of self-harm, suicide attempts, and
2	suicides by each confined inmate during the confined inmate's stay in administrative
3	segregation."
