MTR VEHICLE/VIOLATIONS

EG +\$104,944 GF EX See Note

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Provides relative to the operation of a motor vehicle while using a wireless telecommunication device

<u>Proposed law</u> repeals <u>present law</u> regarding operating wireless telecommunication devices in school zones. <u>Proposed law</u> prohibits all drivers from calling, text messaging, using social networking, using apps, or accessing data on a handheld telecommunication device while driving on a public road or highway, including physically holding the device. <u>Proposed law</u> provides new and enhanced definitions. <u>Proposed</u> law provides for an exception to the wireless telecommunication device prohibition for a law enforcement officer, firefighter, or EMS as well as for any person reporting a traffic accident or other emergency, road hazard, reporting serious injury or death, using a dispatching system, using hands-free GPS, while a vehicle is lawfully stationary, or dialing 911. <u>Proposed law</u> provides for moving violation fines after 01/01/24 up to \$100 for each offense. Beginning 8/01/2024, <u>proposed law</u> requires State Police to annually report the data collected on the race and ethnicity of violators. <u>Proposed law</u> prohibits certain acts of law enforcement officers during traffic stops for violations of proposed law and requires "visually confirms" the violation and prohibits arrests.

EXPENDITURE EXPLANATION

Proposed law is anticipated to increase expenditures within the Dept. of Public Safety and Corrections (DPS), Public Safety Services, Office of Motor Vehicles for suspension of driver's licenses and the Office of State Police to collect race and ethnicity data of each citation from all law enforcement agencies. Under the proposed law, on the third and subsequent violation of texting while driving, a person's driver's license shall be suspended for 30 days.

Office of Motor Vehicles (OMV) - DPS indicates the proposed law requires the Office of Technology Services (OTS) to perform the programming and coding changes of approximately 120 hours of overtime for the Information Services Section to the OMV Driver's License Issuance system at a cost of \$10,348 ($$85 \times 120 = $10,200 \times 1.45\%$ Medicare = \$10,348). The Legislative Fiscal Office presumes additional IT workload associated with this proposed law is incremental in nature and will be accomplished by utilizing existing resources and budget authority. To the extent that numerous pieces of legislation are enacted that require additional programming efforts, the department may require additional resources.

Office of State Police - The proposed law will require modifications to the website that State Police will use to collect data from various law enforcement agencies. DPS reports needing one additional position within the Office of State Police, Technology and Business Support Section to gather information from all law enforcement agencies. The staffing estimate includes salaries and related benefits for one Business Technology Analyst position (\$61,714 salary and \$38,500 related benefits). Other expenditures include office supplies (\$300), automotive maintenance (\$300), telephone (\$336), IAT to OTS for computer equipment (\$1,194), and acquisitions of office furniture (\$1,600) and data equipment (\$1,000). In subsequent fiscal years, the fiscal note presumes a 3% increase in salaries for market rate adjustments and related benefits as the LFO presumes the Business Technology Analyst position will be classified. Local Law Enforcement - The proposed legislation requires all law enforcement agencies to report the race and ethnicity of persons receiving citations for driving while texting to the LA State Police. Therefore, local fund expenditures will increase by an indeterminable amount as a result of local law enforcement agencies submitting the required data to the State Police.

REVENUE EXPLANATION

Proposed law may decrease Local Funds revenues by an indeterminable amount as a result of fines being reduced. Proposed law repeals present law fines of \$500 for the first violation and \$1,000 for 2nd and subsequent violations, but expands the violation to all public roads and highways. Proposed law provides for lower fines of up to \$100 for each offense. Because the number of drivers who may be fined under the proposed law is unknown, revenue derived from this source is indeterminable. However, all fines would accrue to local governing entities.
